The **North Lake High School Seminar program** meets every day during the lunch period for 25 minutes and for 30 minutes Friday. All students are expected to be a part of this program which will allow students to work in the area of careers and their “Educational Development Plan (EDP)”. During seminar, students will also be using the Education 2020 program for ACT/MME preparation. Regular attendance and participation in Group activities will allow each student to earn .25 credit each trimester.

Under the guidelines of the **North Lake High School Student Handbook**, a student is considered **tardy** if they are TEN (10) minutes late to class. A student may still attend class if they are marked tardy. If a student is more than TEN (10) minutes late to class, he/she will be marked absent for that class period. A student may still attend class if marked absent as long as the absence is excused. If a student is tardy three (3) times to a class, those three (3) tardies will become one (1) absence.
