We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2009-2010 educational progress for Lake Shore High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) and teacher quality. For 2009-2010, Lake Shore High School made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in English language arts and mathematics. While we are pleased to have reached this important goal, we are continuously working to improve. We appreciate the continued support of parents, staff and our community in this effort.

State law requires that we also report the following additional information:

**Process for Assigning Pupils to the School**

All resident Lake Shore students are assigned to a school based on the student's age, ability level, and residence location within the district. Resident students wishing to attend a school not within their residence boundaries have the option of requesting a transfer through the Office of Educational Services.

School of choice students are assigned to a school based on the student's age, ability level, and whenever possible, parent request.

**Status of the 3-5 Year School Improvement Plan**

Lake Shore High School is beginning its first year of a new school improvement cycle with the 2010-11 school year. The staff successfully completed the 5 year cycle at the end of the 2009-10 school year.

### **Core Curriculum Information**

Lake Shore teachers and administrators work closely with members of the Macomb Intermediate School District and the Michigan Merit Curriculum. Each grade level follows a scope and sequence that focuses on the high school content expectations provided by the State.

### **Aggregate Student Achievement Results for Local Assessments**

Each year all 10<sup>th</sup> grade Lake Shore High School students are assessed using the PLAN test. The results of these assessments help us determine whether students are achieving the benchmarks and give us information on how to change instructional practices in the future.

In the area of English, 61% of students were proficient according to this assessment. In the area of math 22% of students were deemed proficient. In the area of Reading 37% of students were proficient, and in the area of science 10% were proficient.

### **Students Represented at Parent-Teacher Conferences**

Lake Shore High School holds parent teacher conferences in both winter and spring each year. In the winter 55% of students were represented by a parent (with 618 parents attending) and in the spring 43% of students were represented by at least one parent (472 parents attending).

### **College Equivalence Information**

Lake Shore High School is proud to offer 10 courses that can be taken for college credit. For the 2009-10 school year, 180 students (16.3% of the student body) were enrolled in college equivalent coursework. In addition, 1% of the student population was dual enrolled. Of those students enrolled in college equivalent courses, 46% received a score leading to college credit.

We are very proud that Lake Shore High School has once again made AYP for the 2009-10 school year. We will continue to strive toward excellence for all of our students in the coming school year.
