Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2019-20 educational progress for the Kennedy Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2019-20 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Our school was identified as a "has not been given one of these labels".

Kennedy Middle School continues to focus on creating an environment that fosters a strong school culture and a safe place for students to mature both academically and socially. The use of local data, state-mandated standardized tests, PowerSchool/Schoology and stakeholder surveys, we have successfully identified our progress and areas of improvement. We are proud of the steps we have made towards our goals, but we have more progress to be made. We will continue to focus our efforts on the two areas we have identified to be challenging and a continued focus for improvement.

1. Continue to improve student achievement by addressing our climate and culture.



2. Work to close the achievement gaps within our special education and at-risk populations.

The continued implementation of the Positivity Project this year will continue to help us foster an environment of respect, report, and build a foundation of student success. In addition, our counseling and special education departments have policies and procedures in place to check in on student progress, offer and alter accommodations and communicate with parents about their student's progress.

Kennedy Middle School, in the 2019-20 school year, had another year of growth as there was an increase in proficiency levels and those who attained 'advanced' level status. But we have more work to do with our sub-groups to help them improve their scores on the state-mandated tests. Our School Improvement Team will continue to work with our four core curriculum departments to 'data dive' and focus on the areas/standards we need to address for these high stake tests.

One area that we continue to be proud of is the data from our surveys (Parent, Staff, and Student). In each of the surveys, our rating stayed consistent or, in most areas, increased satisfaction levels. As always, we will continue to plan and execute professional development activities that support our staff to improve student achievement.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

Process for Assigning Pupils to the School

All resident Lake Shore students are assigned to a school based on the student's age, ability level, and residence location within the district. Resident students wishing to attend a school not within their residence boundaries have the option of requesting a transfer through the school office.
